

**Title: Wastewater Plant Operator II**  
**Department: Public Works**

### **General Description**

The purpose of this position is to perform skilled level work in the operation, repair, and maintenance of wastewater treatment plants and sludge disposal facilities including their structures, equipment, and grounds in compliance with applicable permit requirements.

This career ladder series position works under general supervision, independently developing work methods and sequences.

### **Duties and Responsibilities**

*The functions listed below are those that represent the majority of the time spent working in this position. Management may assign additional functions as necessary.*

- Monitors equipment and maintains logbook.
- Takes water samples and flow readings.
- Wastes sludge from the clarifiers.
- Takes "sludge blanket" readings and record in logbook.
- Receives and loads chlorine cylinders.
- Collects dissolved oxygen test samples.
- Cleans still wells and tanks.
- Monitors the telemetry panel and note unusual conditions.
- Changes flow charts.
- Performs general custodial work to keep plant and facilities clean.
- Assists in minor mechanical repairs to mechanical equipment.
- Monitors pumping stations data; in case of problem contacts maintenance personnel to perform corrective actions.
- Operates and cleans concentrators and belt filter presses.
- Participates in preventive maintenance of plant equipment.
- Assists in training of Plant Operator I and Trainee positions.
- Assists in monitoring all plant processes including sludge pumps, flow and chlorine rates, and solids removal and recycling, and septage receiving facilities to ensure proper operation.
- Performs related work as required.

### **Minimum Education and Experience Requirements**

Requires High School graduation or GED equivalent supplemented by two (2) years of operations experience in a wastewater treatment plant, or any combination of experience and training.

### **Additional Requirements:**

Some knowledge of the principles, practices and methods used in wastewater treatment and pumping operations; some knowledge of and prevention of the occupational hazards connected with wastewater facilities; some knowledge of the operation of mechanical and electrical equipment used in wastewater treatment and pumping; knowledge to maintain and adjust pumps, chemical feed machines and other plant equipment; ability to follow oral and written instructions; ability to perform manual labor; ability to establish and maintain effective working

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relationship with coworkers and supervisors; working knowledge of personal computers and pertinent applications; regular and timely attendance; performance of duties in a safe manner.

**Americans with Disabilities Act Requirements:**

This is medium work requiring the exertion of 50 pounds of force occasionally, up to 20 pounds of force frequently, and up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects; work requires climbing, balancing, stooping, kneeling, crouching, crawling, reaching, standing, walking, pushing, pulling, lifting, fingering, grasping, feeling, and repetitive motions; vocal communication is required for expressing or exchanging ideas by means of the spoken word, and conveying detailed or important instructions to others accurately, loudly, or quickly; hearing is required to perceive information at normal spoken word levels, and to receive detailed information through oral communications and/or to make fine distinctions in sound; physical attendance at work site is required to perform manual tasks, provide immediate service to onsite customers, and supervise or interact with work group; visual acuity is required for depth perception, color perception, visual inspection involving small defects and/or small parts, use of measuring devices, assembly or fabrication of parts at or within arm's length, operation of machines, operation of motor vehicles or equipment, determining the accuracy and thoroughness of work, and observing general surroundings and activities; mental acuity is required to make rational decisions through sound logic and deduction; the worker is subject to inside and outside environmental conditions, extreme cold, extreme heat, noise, vibration, hazards, atmospheric conditions, and oils. The worker may be exposed to blood borne pathogens and may be required to wear specialized personal protective equipment.

**Special Certifications and License Requirements:**

- Must possess and maintain a valid state driver's license with an acceptable driving history.
- Possession and retention of a valid Level II Wastewater Operator license issued by the State of Delaware.
